Smoking

In accordance with Queensland legislation, the following areas have been designated smoking or non-smoking:

Smoking Permitted

Designated outdoor smoking area (DOSAs) on the verandah, the putting green, and the carpark.

Note: Food cannot be consumed in these areas.

Smoking Not Permitted

Any area of the Clubhouse including the Hatch, excluding DOSAs.

Golf

Handicapping

All Australian handicapping is administered centrally by Golf Australia via 'Golf Link'. A player shall hold only one handicap at one club in Australia, this is called your home club. The Maximum handicap for men is 36 and for ladies 45.

Members must first be allocated a handicap before playing in any competition. The Member must submit three cards properly marked and signed by a golfer who holds a current handicap. These cards are to be sent to the Office who will allocate the handicap. Any previously held Australian handicap and handicap record must be reinitiated.

It is imperative that players return all score cards in competition rounds. Failure to do so may result in their handicap losing its full status and becoming provisional. This will occur when five or more entries in their most recent 20 actual scores are "No- Score Not Approved"

Club Fixture of Events

The Club's Fixture of Events is available from the office, the book lists all competitions for Men and Women for the Club's calendar year.

Play Availability and Fees

Play is available to members guests every day. Please note that that on Saturday's members guests may only book on the day of play, Golfink or PGA cards are required and that members are responsible in ensuring their guests comply with the Clubs regulations. Play is available to visitors and public every day, subject to availability. Please note that visitors and public are required to sign in at the Proshop for contact tracing purposes.

- Green Fees will apply. 18-hole competition, \$14.00, 9-hole competition, \$7.00, and relevant social play fees apply.
- Timesheets for each day's play will be released eight (8) days, at 6.30pm in advance.
- Play will only be permitted with a booking (competition and social).
- Maximum of 4 players a group.
- Tee times will be at 7-minute intervals.

Competition Play runs at the following times:

- Monday (One Tee Start) – 7.00am to 12.30pm (18 Holes)
- Tuesday (Two Tee Start) – 7.15am to 12.40pm (18 Holes) 9.00am-9.10am (9 Holes)
- Wednesday (One Tee Start) – 7.00am to 12.30pm (18 Holes)
- Thursday (Two Tee Start) – 7.30am to 8.40am (18 Holes) 8.50am to 9.00am (9 Holes)
WOMEN ONLY
- Friday (One Tee Start) – 6.30am to 12.30pm (18 Holes)
- Saturday (Two Tee Start) – 6.30am to 12.30pm (18 Holes)
- Sunday (One Tee Start) – 8.15am to 12.15pm (18 Holes)

Social Play runs at the following times:

- Monday (One Tee Start) – 6.00am to 5.00pm (18/9 Holes)
- Tuesday (One Tee Start) – 6.00am to 6.40am and 3.00pm to 5.00pm (9 Holes)
- Wednesday (One Tee Start) – 6.00am to 6.40am and 1.00pm to 5.00pm (18/9 Holes)
- Thursday (One Tee Start) – 6.00am to 6.50am (9 Holes) and 11.00am to 5.00pm (18/9 Holes)
- Friday (One Tee Start) – 1.00pm to 5.00pm (18/9 Holes)
- Saturday (Two Tee Start) – 3.00pm to 5.00pm (9 Holes)
- Sunday (1st Tee Start) – 6.30am to 7.30am (9 Holes) and 12.30pm to 5.00pm (18/9 Holes)

Please note social play is not permitted within competition times, and no play from members or visitors is available prior to 6am.



Bookings

Bookings for Club competitions and social play may be made via the Club's website (mobile user friendly), or by contacting the office prior to the event or the ProShop on the day of play.

A member may place no more than four (4) names on the time sheet. It is important to be aware that if your name is placed on the time sheet and you do not arrive to play you may receive a 'No Show' letter and invoice for the daily competition fee from the Club. The Club has an active playing membership and times for competition play particularly Saturdays are at a premium.

All members and visitors must report to the ProShop prior to play. This applies to full 18 hole, 9 hole and lesser hole rounds and play.

BYO Alcohol is not permitted on the golf course.

Competitions

Results: Competition results can be found on the Club's website by clicking on Golf then Latest Results then Results on the relevant date.

Local Rules: Local Rules for the golf course can be found on the back of the scorecard and Local Rule Board located behind the first tee. A breach of a Local Rule usually carries a penalty of two strokes in stroke play or loss of hole in match play.



Pace of Play

Four hours, fifteen minutes is used as a guide for 18 holes, but several factors will determine the anticipated time from day to day e.g., the number in each group, type of competition, length of course, length of rough, speed of greens, weather conditions, etc.

There are several things that will assist the pace of play:

- Proceed to the tee when you are called on standby.
- If you cannot score on a hole, pick up and mark only a score for the person who has the score that counts towards the fourball. Mark (p) for the other person.
- Be ready to move off the green as soon as the last player has putted out.
- Be prepared to play out of turn.
- Be prepared to call a group through.
- Keep practice swings to a minimum.
- All players should always be aware of the group's position in the field.
- Keep halfway stops to a minimum, even if the group ahead is still teeing off.

REMEMBER – KEEP UP WITH THE GROUP AHEAD, NOT AHEAD OF THE GROUP BEHIND.

Practice Facilities

- Practice Fairway – located across the road opposite the Club, maximum distance 120m.
- Putting Green – located between the Club house and 10th tee.
- Practice Nets – located near the 10th Tee in the carpark.

Tuesday Club

Members of Wynnum Golf Club may play in the morning field of any Tuesday competition, to play in the afternoon they must join the Tuesday Club and enjoy the following benefits:

Membership \$20.00 per year.

- 2 free drinks and dinner days after golf, throughout the year including the PK Cup & Tony Charlton Memorial.
- Some free drink days after golf on nominated days throughout the year.
- Must be a Tuesday Club Member to play in the PM field on Tuesday's.
- Bookings for PM on Tuesday to be made with the Pro Shop on the day of play.
- To join, see the Tuesday Club committee or register to play in the PM field on Tuesday and pay your membership after golf.

Reciprocal Clubs

Wynnum Golf Club has reciprocal memberships rights with many courses throughout Australia and overseas. Clubs are listed on on the website.

Women's Golf Management Committee

The Women's Golf Management Committee is responsible for running Ladies Golf Competitions (Tuesday and Thursday) including associated functions.

Course

Care of Course

Raking Bunkers

- Never walk down the face of a bunker, always enter the bunker from the lowest edge ensuring minimal disturbance to the bunker face.
- Before leaving the bunker, a player should rake the area from where they have just played and return the rake to the middle of the bunker with the rake head pointing in the general line of play.

Repair Divots and Ball Marks

- Through the green a player should ensure that any turf cut or displaced by him/her, is repaired at once by digging in the sides of the divot and then applying sand.
- Damage to the putting green (pitch mark) caused by the ball is to be repaired as soon as you step on the green.
- All players are requested to carry a sand bucket to facilitate repair of divot marks in fairways, tees and rough.

Carts

- Club notices and cart directional signage regulating the movement of golf carts are to be strictly observed. It should be particularly noted that carts must not be driven within 5 metres around greens (unless on the cart path).

Course Maintenance Etiquette

The following rules of etiquette have been prepared in the interests of personal safety, course management and golfing enjoyment:

- Greens staff have the right of way in performance of their duties. (It is recognised this may cause some inconvenience to golfers and Greens staff will endeavour to carry out their duties to minimise interference).
- Golfers are required to exercise care when playing in the vicinity of Greens staff and not play while Greens staff are within range. Golfers must wait until they are 'called on' before playing into areas where green staff are working. Golfers are requested to stand aside to allow mowers and other heavy machinery items to clear their intended area of play.

Observance of these simple rules will enable Greens staff to fulfil their duties with minimum interference, and at the same time because the least possible inconvenience to players.

Any comments/criticism should be addressed to either the General Manager or a Board Member. At no times should course staff be approached for this purpose.
